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PARENT-CHILD PASS

The Parent-Child Pass supports health care for pregnant women and children up to five years old. You usually receive the Parent-Child Pass from your specialist doctor in gynecology (women's health). Your gynecology, paediatrics, and general medicine doctors record each examination in the Parent-Child Pass. In total, 18 examinations are scheduled for mother and child. Part of this is a requirement for receiving the full childcare allowance. A confirmation of the Parent-Child Pass examinations is also necessary for the Parent-Child allowance from the state of Upper Austria. Between the 18th and 22nd week of pregnancy, there is the opportunity to receive a free one-hour consultation with a midwife as part of the Parent-Child Pass. The consultation includes information on the course of pregnancy, childbirth, the postnatal period, breastfeeding, health-promoting behaviour during this time, and further support options.

PREGNANCY NOTIFICATION

As soon as the pregnancy is known, the employer must be informed and the expected date of birth communicated. A medical certificate must be provided upon request. When a woman receives the Parent-Child Pass from her doctor, the pregnancy is officially confirmed. This is the appropriate time to inform the workplace. However, if the pregnancy is not reported immediately, there are no penalties. Expectant mothers are also required to notify their employer of the start of the protection period no later than four weeks before it begins.

The employer is obligated to report the employee's pregnancy to the responsible labor inspectorate. In larger companies, the company doctor must also be informed.

MATERNITY PROTECTION

From the moment pregnancy is reported to the employer, the provisions of the Maternity Protection Act take effect. The Maternity Protection Act (MSchG) regulates all protective measures for expectant mothers and applies to all female employees (including those in minor employment), regardless of whether they are in a public-law or private employment relationship, as well as to apprentices and homeworkers. Some special provisions

apply differently to employees working in the public sector or in private households. Once the pregnancy is disclosed, your employer is obliged to ensure that you do not physically overexert yourself. Because this can potentially be dangerous for the unborn child.

EMPLOYMENT BAN

There are special protective regulations to safeguard pregnant women and their unborn children. Generally, heavy physical work is prohibited. In case of doubt, the labor inspectorate determines which tasks are hazardous to health and therefore forbidden. An absolute employment ban applies from eight weeks before until eight weeks after the expected childbirth (protection period or maternity protection). In cases of multiple births, premature births, and cesarean sections, the protection period after birth is at least 12 weeks. If the eight-week period before childbirth is shortened, the protection period after birth is extended by the same amount, but not exceeding 16 weeks. During the employment ban, female employees and self-employed service providers are generally entitled to maternity allowance.

PROTECTION AGAINST TERMINATION

Expectant mothers and parents on parental leave or parental part-time work are protected against termination and dismissal. This protection begins with the notification of pregnancy or the reporting of parental leave/parental part-time work, at the earliest four months before the start of parental leave/parental part-time work, and lasts until four months after childbirth or up to four weeks after the end of parental leave. In the case of parental leave, the protection against termination and dismissal ends at the latest four weeks after

the child's second birthday, and in the case of parental part-time work, at the latest four weeks after the child's fourth birthday. Terminations or dismissals issued during the protected period without judicial consent are legally invalid, are considered not to have been issued, and do not terminate the employment relationship.

ATTENTION: If a termination is issued by the employer before the pregnancy is disclosed, the pregnancy must be reported within five days after the termination by providing a medical certificate. In the event of a miscarriage, protection against termination and dismissal applies for up to four weeks following the event.

CHILDBIRTH PREPARATION

You have approximately nine months to prepare for life with a new person. To be well prepared for the birth, there are a wide range of services available.

PREGNANCY APPS

This probably most exciting time of your life brings not only many feelings of happiness but also many small and big questions. In addition to guidebooks, blogs, and experienced friends, there are also several practical apps.

Here is a small selection of free apps for smartphones:

ÖGK ...von Anfang an

Many great tips and information on pregnancy and baby-related topics: nutrition advice, remedies for nausea, baby name charts, and information about the baby's development.

BabyCenter

This app stands out for its wealth of helpful information: a pregnancy calendar, daily health and fitness tips, recipes, and nutrition advice. After birth, it transforms from a pregnancy app into a parenting app. Very practical, as you won't need a separate app for your early days with your baby.

Schwangerschaft +

Daily information about the progress of pregnancy, a personal diary, weight tracking, and an appointment calendar for your doctor visits, plus even a name finder! Especially great: The app can be set to include fathers (as well as grandma, grandpa, best friend, and others)!

Sprout

In 3D, you can see what the baby looks like at the respective week of pregnancy and how it is developing. Pregnancy planner for managing tasks and appointments, including checklists and a pregnancy diary.

iMamaPapa

Provides answers to thousands of questions that arise from the very first month: medically reliable, updated weekly, focused on the essentials, and for the first time designed equally for both mom and dad. Hooray, I am going to be a father! A helpful app for expectant fathers, offering videos on the key topics to prepare for the arrival of their child.

Keleya

The app offers workout and yoga exercises that are precisely tailored to your pregnancy week and safe to perform. You will also find healthy recipes and expert videos on various topics related to pregnancy, such as breathing exercises for childbirth.

Babelli

Everything you need to know during your pregnancy is available in this app, for example, how to stay fit and healthy and how to prepare for childbirth and life as a mother.

ANTENATAL CLASSES /

PREGNANCY EXERCISE

Antenatal classes and pregnancy exercise are offered throughout Upper Austria in hospital maternity wards, by midwives, adult education centers, parent-child centers, private associations, and more. (See local section.)

INFANT CARE

Newborns are unique individuals from the very beginning. This also applies to the condition of their skin, their regulation of temperature and digestion, and consequently, their excretions.

Infant care courses are offered in maternity wards, by midwives, in parent-child centers, and elsewhere.

SMOKE-FREE FROM THE START!

Quitting smoking during pregnancy has especially positive effects. It optimally supports both the mother's health and the baby's development. Professional, respectful, and personalized support makes weaning easier. The Austrian Health Insurance Fund (ÖGK) supports women and their partners around childbirth with online resources, videos, information about the Smoke-free Phone, the Smoke-free App, and current campaigns: 'Smoke-free from the Start.' Individual counseling is confidential and free of charge and is provided by specially trained psychologists from the Occupational Health Service Linz.

MIDWIVES

The scope of work for midwives is broad and comprehensive. Midwives work in various departments in hospitals: in delivery rooms, postnatal wards, outpatient clinics, and fertility departments. Many work independently in midwifery practices or birthing centers, assist with home births, work as family midwives, offer courses, and provide home visits during pregnancy and the postnatal period. Midwives support women throughout pregnancy, childbirth, and the following days and weeks. During this important time in life, they offer their knowledge and expertise.

Childbirth Preparation

Midwives provide a wide range of antenatal classes in practices, counseling centers, hospitals, and other institutions.

Midwifery Counseling

As part of the midwife consultation in the Mother-Child Pass, pregnant women can access free midwifery counseling between the 18th and 22nd week of pregnancy. They can receive free midwifery counseling and establish early contact with a midwife. The consultation is offered as a supplementary service to medical check-ups and has a counseling function. It covers topics such as choosing the place of birth, nutrition and exercise during pregnancy, and information on health-promoting and preventive behaviors.

Costs

Every woman has the right to the support of a midwife. Midwifery care is a service covered by health insurance. The services provided by contracted midwives are uniformly regulated across Austria by an agreement with the Austrian Midwifery Board. Home visits, midwifery care during a home birth, as well as various materials and medications required for midwifery care and the postnatal period, are covered.

Therefore, you do not need to pay a private fee for the contractual services. When cared for by a chosen midwife, 80% of the standard health insurance rate is reimbursed. You can find the current names, phone numbers, and information of midwives in Upper Austria here:

142 - MIDWIFE CONSULTATION HOUR

The midwife consultation hour is a service offered by TelefonSeelsorge Upper Austria – Emergency Number 142 and the Austrian Midwives' Association (ÖHG), Regional Office Upper Austria. Every Monday between 9 and 11 a.m., a midwife answers all questions by phone at number 142 regarding conception, pregnancy, birth, postnatal period, breastfeeding, and infant care and nutrition – confidentially and free of charge, regardless of the caller's age, place of residence, or income.

This service is now being updated to match parents' media use and expanded to include a midwife chat. This counseling service can be accessed easily, free of charge, and confidentially.

On two afternoons each week (every Tuesday and Thursday from 4:00 p.m.), midwives answer all questions related to fertility, pregnancy, childbirth, the postnatal period, breastfeeding, introduction of complementary foods, and much more. The midwives support those seeking advice in the chat with their extensive experience and professionally guide them on the journey to parenthood.

DiA – Doulas in Austria

A DiA doula accompanies women throughout childbirth with experience, mindfulness, encouraging words, and practical assistance. Through their continuous presence, support, and encouragement, they contribute significantly to a positive birth environment for the pregnant

woman and her partner. However, during childbirth, they are not a substitute for a midwife. Midwives are medically trained and essential as birth companions. You can find doulas near you on the homepage.

ADOPTION

You are expecting a baby and cannot raise it yourself. What should you do? What happens next? Questions and thoughts that go through your mind when everything feels hopeless because of a pregnancy. If you are considering placing your child for adoption, please contact an adoption counseling center informally during pregnancy. There, you will receive impartial support and help with decision-making.

The first point of contact for the placement of an adopted child is the youth department of the respective district authorities or the magistrate's office for youth and family. If you decide to keep your baby in this situation, child and youth welfare services are available to help you find a solution for you and your child.

CONSENT TO ADOPTION

If you wish to give your child up for adoption, please contact an adoption counseling center during pregnancy without any obligation. The mother can sign the consent form for adoption immediately after the birth and chooses the type of adoption (confidential adoption, open adoption, or semi-open adoption). Afterward, suitable adoptive parents are sought for the child. In some cases, the consent of additional persons is also required. The placement of a child for adoption is conducted with the utmost confidentiality, respecting the wishes of the relinquishing mother. **WARNING!** The mother may withdraw her consent to the adoption until the court grants approval. This period usually lasts about six months. During this time, how the adoptive parents manage with the child and how the child is settling with their new parents is carefully observed. Adoptive parents can still withdraw from the adoption during this period.

IT'S TIME!

The more secure and supported you feel from the very beginning during your hospital stay, the more comfortable your child will feel.

To help you choose a suitable clinic or welcoming hospital, we provide an overview of maternity facilities in Upper Austria. Each hospital and maternity ward, usually including the delivery room, can be visited beforehand. Please also make use of the midwifery counseling provided in the Mother-Child Pass between the 18th and 22nd weeks of pregnancy.

It is always helpful to calmly address questions and personal wishes. In short: Do everything you can to be as relaxed as possible, both emotionally and physically, before and after the big day. As always, when it comes to securing places: Please register as early as possible, ideally within the first few months, as beds can become limited at any time.

OUTPATIENT BIRTH

Some women choose outpatient birth, a combination of childbirth in hospital and postnatal care at home. (Discharge occurs within 24 hours after birth.) For good reason, you do not want to miss out on the safety that a hospital with its technical and medical facilities provides during childbirth. However, afterwards you prefer to be at home with your baby in a cozy and familiar environment. During the first five days of life, a midwife visit is scheduled daily. During these visits, the midwife monitors, among other things, uterine recovery and wound healing, as well as the development of the newborn. She is the point of contact for any questions that arise. If planning an outpatient birth, it is important to get in touch with a midwife as early as possible.

THE BIRTHING CENTER

A birthing center (also known as a midwife practice or maternity home) is an independent, out-of-hospital birthing facility run by one or more midwives, where women can give birth in privacy and babies are born in a safe environment. A birthing center is a good alternative to a home birth. You can benefit from the advantages of a home birth, such as the comfortable atmosphere, privacy, self-determination, ample time for the natural birth process, and comprehensive care from a midwife who already knows you. At the same time, everything is prepared for the birth, and the hospital is nearby (2.4 km). At the Steyr birthing center, you will be cared for and supported by Natascha van Riet (and if this is your first baby – also by a doula). At a non-binding information evening, we can get to know each other and discuss any questions about support at the birthing center. Please register early in pregnancy, as we only support a few women each month.

THE HOME BIRTH

A healthy woman with an uncomplicated pregnancy can also give birth at home. Giving birth in the familiar environment of the family can give women a sense of security that positively affects the progress of birth and the postnatal period.

Good preparation is important if you decide on a home birth:

Engage the midwife you have carefully chosen no later than the 20th week of pregnancy. Attend all check-up appointments diligently. Consider registering at a nearby clinic in case complications occur. Arrange support from your family and/or a household helper for the time of childbirth.

Midwives provide compassionate and attentive care to women from the beginning of pregnancy. Parents are involved in decision-making. After the birth, the midwife visits your home for up to eight weeks to support you with all questions related to caring for your newborn and parenting.

ANONYMOUS BIRTH

Pregnant women who, for various reasons, do not want or cannot keep their child have the option to give birth anonymously. The goal is to prevent secret and unattended births or child abandonment. After birth, the child is cared for by child and youth welfare services and is usually placed with adoptive parents. Medical care before and after birth for the mother is also available anonymously.

BABY NEST / BABY DROP-OFF

For mothers who feel unable to care for their child after birth, there should be no way around one of the so-called 'baby nests.' This is the only way for mothers to be certain that their child is cared for in the best possible way. At a baby nest, the mother enters a heated room where she has a few more minutes to say goodbye to her child. Twenty minutes after the baby nest door is closed, an alarm is triggered, and the child is taken into safe hands and professional care. The medical team can also be contacted by the mother at any time, anonymously and without fear, to answer any questions about the child's condition. Information sheets on this are available locally. Just as with anonymous birth, custody of the child transfers to child

and youth welfare services when the baby nest is used. After a 14-day waiting period, an adoption procedure for the child will be initiated. Mothers can confidently turn to various support centers after their child is released. You can find a "baby nest" at:

POSTNATAL EXERCISE

There are many good reasons to participate in postnatal exercise classes after the birth of a baby. For example, to strengthen the pelvic floor, prevent prolapse of internal organs to avoid incontinence, strengthen your abdomen and back, and to help you regain your energy and enjoyment after childbirth.

Postnatal exercise classes are offered in hospital maternity wards, by midwives, in parent-child centers, and at adult education centers (VHS). ...

PHYSIOTHERAPY FOR MOTHERS

After the postnatal period, if pelvic floor dysfunctions or imbalances persist, including urinary and/or fecal incontinence or prolapse issues, the ÖGK offers young mothers individual or group therapeutic exercises.

Around the time of birth, the lives of all family members change. If the joy of the new addition to the family is overshadowed by psychological difficulties, the ÖGK offers professional support. Psychotherapy can be accessed as individual or group therapy with a qualified psychotherapist. In individual therapy, the session typically lasts 50 minutes; for group therapy, it is 45 or 90 minutes. If the psychotherapy is provided by a contracted provider, the ÖGK covers the costs.

- Information about existing statutory entitlements such as maternity allowance, childcare allowance, assistance with childcare allowance, Parent-Child Pass examinations, midwife services, and more.
- Counselling on personal, social, legal (including immigration-related), and financial matters.
- Referral to suitable institutions.
- Financial and material bridging assistance when needed and following an assessment of the financial situation.
- Information on further support options available in cases of financial hardship.
- Support with official contacts

Digital Babypoint – Online Services

The Digital Babypoint helps you organize tasks related to pregnancy and birth with a personalized checklist. After initial registration, you can also use the service 'First Issuance of Documents' to apply for the birth certificate, proof of citizenship, and confirmation of registration. To use the online services, you need an ID Austria or EU Login.

Notification of Birth

The birth of a newborn must be reported to the responsible registry office within one week. Births in a clinic or similar facility are reported by the institution's management. For home births, the birth notification is issued by the doctor or midwife, and the mother or parents must submit it to the registry office.

The baby's birth certificate

Upon request by the mother or parents, the registry office will issue the birth certificate with the birth notification, and if the child has Austrian citizenship, a proof of citizenship.

To register the birth of your child, you will need the following documents:

- Official photo IDs of the parents (or mother)
- Birth certificates of the parents (or mother)
- Proofs of citizenship of the parents (or mother)
- Marriage certificate (if married)
- Registration confirmation of the parents (or mother)
- If applicable, partnership certificate
- If applicable, divorce certificate
- If applicable, proof of academic degrees of the parents or mother
- If applicable Proof of acknowledgment of paternity
- Form 'Notification of Birth' if the birth was not reported by the hospital

For nationals of a foreign country:

- All foreign-language documents in the original and with a certified translation

There are cooperations between some registry offices and hospitals, so that the relevant hospitals transmit the documents required for issuing the first birth certificate, together with the 'Notification of Birth' form, to the registry office. Please inquire at the hospital or the responsible registry office. You can also collect the birth certificate and birth confirmation there.

Initial registration of newborns

The residence registration of a newborn can be done at the same time as the birth notification at the registry office, provided a registration form has been completed beforehand (usually at the hospital). If the registration is already completed at the registry office, a visit to the registration authority is no longer necessary.

If the newborn is to be registered under the legal guardian, the registration obligation applies to them. They sign as the accommodation provider and as the person responsible for registration. If the child is not registered with the legal guardian, the registration obligation falls on the accommodation provider. Deadline: within three days after returning from the maternity ward.

Name law

If the parents share the same family name, the child will also bear that name. However, it is also possible for a double name, assigned to one parent at the time of marriage, to be designated as the child's family name. If the parents do not share a common family name (for example, if they are not married), the family name of one parent may be chosen as the child's family name. Furthermore, the child may be given a double name formed from the family names of both parents, according to applicable provisions. The child's family name is generally to be determined jointly by the parents who have custody rights. If the parents cannot agree on a family name, or if no family name is determined for the child, the child will be given the mother's surname. If only one parent has custody, that parent has the right to decide the name. If the family name of the parents or one parent changes, or if the parents marry each other, the child's family name may be determined again.

Acknowledgment of paternity

The father of a child born out of wedlock can acknowledge his paternity by making a formal declaration. To issue the acknowledgment of paternity, the father must appear personally at a competent authority and declare paternity in a domestic public or officially certified document. Required documents: Official photo ID, registration certificate (if not residing in Austria), birth certificate, proof of citizenship, proof of academic degree, passport or identity card (for foreign nationals). If the father is a minor, the consent and official photo ID of the legal representative are also required.

Responsible authority

The acknowledgment of paternity must be made at the competent registry office, a child and youth welfare agency, or a notary in Austria. If you wish to complete the acknowledgment at the district court, it is usually the court responsible for the district where the child—or, if acknowledged before birth, the mother—has their habitual residence.

At the registry office, the acknowledgment of paternity, birth registration, and custody arrangements can be completed at the same time.

Passport/Identity card for children

Austrian citizenship is a prerequisite for the issuance of an Austrian passport.

For children and minors under the age of 14, the application must be submitted by their legal representative. Minors aged between 14 and 18 may apply for the passport themselves, provided they have the consent of their legal representative. Children (including toddlers) and adolescents must be present with their legal representative during the application to ensure clear proof of identity.

Required documents: official photo ID of the applying parent, the child's birth certificate, the child's proof of citizenship, and a passport photo not older than six months (complying with ICAO standards). For children up to 12 years old, the child passport with a chip is issued without a fingerprint. The first passport and identity card for newborns up to their second birthday are issued free of charge on the occasion of birth. The child's passport after the second birthday costs €30 / express delivery €45 / one-day express delivery €165. The passport with a chip from the twelfth birthday costs €75.90 with RSb delivery / express delivery €100 / one-day express delivery €220.

Responsible authorities:

- The district administration office
- In statutory cities, the municipal office

Applications for passports can be submitted anywhere in the country – regardless of residence – at any passport authority.

Notification to social insurance

Notification of a child to social insurance usually occurs automatically with the birth registration and is processed on the same working day. A social insurance number is then already assigned.

- After notification, the child receives their own e-card by mail.
- You can use the e-card without a signature for children under 14 years of age.
- Take the e-card with you to the Mother-Child Pass examinations.
- If your child has multiple insurance coverages, you can decide at the doctor's office which health insurance to use for your child's services. However,

only one e-card can be issued.

- If children travel with their school, the e-card should definitely be taken along.

The annual fee for the e-card is waived for children and young people who are co-insured with their parents.

MATERNITY ALLOWANCE

Maternity allowance is granted to all female employees as well as to women who receive benefits from unemployment insurance (e.g., unemployment benefit, emergency assistance, etc.). The maternity allowance is paid for the last eight weeks before the expected date of childbirth, on the day of childbirth, and for the first eight weeks following birth. If an early employment ban is issued for medical reasons by the official doctor or labor inspector, entitlement to maternity allowance begins from that time. After childbirth, the entitlement is extended to 12 weeks in cases of premature or multiple births, or if the delivery was by caesarean section. For the ÖGK to continue paying maternity allowance after childbirth, you need to provide a copy of the birth certificate. Please submit it in a timely manner. The maternity allowance will be transferred to you every four weeks in arrears. The maternity allowance fully replaces the net income, based on the average earnings of the last 13 weeks (or the last three calendar months) before the start of maternity leave. Special payments (holiday pay, Christmas bonus) are included as percentage supplements.

Women who received unemployment benefit or emergency assistance before maternity leave will receive an 80% supplement on their last benefit payment. Recipients of childcare allowance who were entitled to maternity allowance for the previous childbirth receive maternity allowance equal to the amount of the childcare allowance. Self-insured persons with minor employment receive a fixed daily amount of €11.87 (2025).

You will receive the application for maternity allowance from your gynecologist, who confirms the expected due date on the back. The front must be completed by your employer. This work and income confirmation for maternity allowance should be submitted to the health insurance fund at the start of the postnatal care period.

DADDY MONTH & FAMILY TIME BONUS

Fathers who wish to dedicate themselves exclusively to their family immediately after the birth of their child and interrupt their employment have a legal right to leave related to the birth of the child ('Daddy Month'). There must be a shared household with the child, and the notification deadlines to the employer must be met.

Same-sex couples can also claim entitlement for the second parent.

The 'Family Time Bonus' amounting to around €1600 - 1700 monthly (2025) is the financial benefit during the 'Dad month'. Since January 1, 2023, the Family Time Bonus is no longer offset against childcare allowance later claimed by the father.

CHILDCARE ALLOWANCE

Requirements:

- Entitlement to and receipt of the Family Allowance
- according to Main residence with the child
- Implementation and proof of the U1 examinations
- Center of life in Austria
- Compliance with the additional income limit per calendar year
- Non-Austrian citizens must have legal residence in Austria or meet specific asylum law requirements

Types of benefits

You can receive the childcare allowance in two ways: either via the flexible childcare allowance account or as income-related childcare allowance. The childcare allowance account (a flat-rate benefit) is a family benefit paid independently of previous employment or compulsory insurance.

The choice of benefit type must be made at the initial application and also binds the other parent. A change is strictly only possible within 14 days of the initial application!

Duration of entitlement and benefit amount (2025)

The benefit period of the KBG account can be flexibly chosen within a specified range.

- One parent can choose between 365 and 851 days from the child's birth,
- while if both parents claim benefits, the period ranges from 456 to 1,063 days.

- The daily benefit amount is €41.14 in the shortest option and €17.65 in the longest. The longer the benefit is received, the lower the daily amount becomes.
- The income-dependent KBG is granted
- for up to 365 days from the child's birth if claimed by only one parent.
- If claimed by both parents, the maximum period is 426 days.

The income-dependent childcare allowance amounts to 80% of the last income, up to a maximum of €80.12 per day.

NEW: Since 2023, the daily rates have been automatically indexed every January, meaning they are adjusted for inflation.

Change of caregiver

To use the entire care period, at least one change of caregiver must take place; a maximum of two changes are allowed in total. A care block must last at least 61 days.

Simultaneous receipt

Simultaneous receipt of childcare allowance by both parents is possible for up to 31 days (at the first change).

Partnership bonus

If parents each spend roughly equal time caring for the child, each parent is entitled, upon application after the overall allowance period, to a partnership bonus of €500 as a one-time payment.

Extension of the benefit period in hardship cases

In special cases, the entitlement to the lump-sum KBG (KBG account) can be extended beyond the maximum 91 days granted to a single parent as follows:

- The second parent is unable to receive the KBG during the extension period due to an event (death, stay in a health or care facility, court- or authority-confirmed domestic violence, stay in a women's shelter, imprisonment).
- A permanently single parent has filed an application with the court to determine child maintenance and has a maximum net income of €1,400 (including family benefits), plus €300 per month for each additional person in the household for whom maintenance is provided.

For births from November 1, 2023, there is also an entitlement to a hardship extension of up to 61 days beyond the maximum period entitled to a single parent, with a special daily payment of €41.14 (2025) when receiving eaKBG.

Low-income parents can apply for assistance towards the flat-rate childcare allowance in the amount of €6.06 per day. Assistance is granted if, and as long as, there is an entitlement to payment of the childcare allowance. Eligible are:

- Single parents who provide a document identifying the other parent and declare that they have no partnership with the other parent or any other person. The additional income of the parent receiving benefits must not exceed €8,600 per calendar year from 2025 onwards.
- Couples are mothers or fathers who are married or living in a registered partnership or cohabitation. The additional income of the parent receiving benefits must not exceed €8,600 / €18,000 of the other parent or partner, per calendar year.

Assistance is granted for a maximum duration of 365 days from the date of application. It is not granted during the extension of benefits in hardship cases, when receiving income-dependent childcare allowance, or to both parents simultaneously. All changes must be reported immediately.

Multiple Child Supplement:

For multiple births, a 50% supplement is granted for each additional child. This supplement does not apply under the income-related variant of the Childcare Allowance.

Where to apply?

It is recommended to submit the application for the Childcare Allowance shortly after the birth. The responsible health insurance provider is the one from which maternity allowance was received, or under which you are currently insured (entitled), or with which you were last insured. If there has been no previous insurance, ÖGK (Austrian Health Insurance Fund) is responsible. Each parent must submit their own application.

SELF-INSURANCE

Self-insurance generally becomes necessary when

- mandatory insurance ends (e.g., due to the end of the childcare allowance period)
- there is no option for co-insurance with spouses, partners (e.g., child's father), or parents (for students).

The following forms of self-insurance apply:

- self-insurance in health insurance
- preferential self-insurance for students or self-insurance for marginally employed persons.

PENSION SPLITTING

www.pv.at

Under pension splitting, up to 50% of the pension credits of the employed parent can be transferred to the partner who is engaged in child-rearing after the child's birth.

Partial credits can be transferred from the calendar year of the child's birth until the calendar year in which the child turns seven. If multiple children are born, transfers are possible for a maximum of 14 calendar years.

An informal application must be submitted in writing by the child's 10th birthday. to be submitted within the child's first year of life.

FAMILY ALLOWANCE

Entitlement

Parents are entitled to family allowance

- whose center of life is in Austria and
- whose child (including adoptive, foster, step, and grandchild) lives with them in the same household or for whom they provide the majority of financial support if the child does not belong to any parent's household.
- regardless of the parents' employment or income.
- generally only for children who reside permanently in Austria.
- up to the completion of the child's 24th year of life. In exceptional cases, up to the completion of the child's 25th year of life.

NEW: Since January 2023, social benefits including family allowance, sibling increments, school start allowance, and others are indexed and thus adjusted for inflation.

Amount of the family allowance

As of 2025

- 0 to 3 years: € 138.40
- 3 to 10 years: € 148.00
- 10 to 19 years: € 171.80
- 19 to 24 years: € 200.40
- Supplement for a severely disabled child: € 189,20.

Sibling scale

The total amount of the family allowance increases monthly as follows:

- for 2 children by € 8.60 per child
- for 3 children by € 21.10 per child
- for 4 children by € 32.20 per child
- for 5 children by € 38.90 per child
- for 6 children by € 43.40 per child
- for 7 or more children by € 63.10 per child

School start allowance

As part of the family allowance payment for August, a school start allowance of € 121.40 is granted for each child aged 6 to 15. No separate application is required.

Child tax credit

It is paid simultaneously with the family allowance di-

rectly through the tax office. It does not need to be applied for separately. It amounts to €70.90 per child per month.

Application process

When a child is born, the family allowance no longer needs to be applied for (application-free family allowance). The tax authorities automatically review all the requirements and transfer the family allowance to the parents' account. If any information is missing, the parents will be asked to provide it.

Multiple child supplement

Parents can receive the multiple child supplement from three children onwards if the family income does not exceed a certain legal threshold. The supplement amounts to €24.40 per month for the third and each additional child. It must be claimed separately for each calendar year and is paid out or considered as part of the employee tax assessment or income tax return. If you have no taxable income, direct payment by the responsible authority is possible.

PARENTAL LEAVE

Employed mothers, fathers, or foster parents (employees) have a legal right to parental leave (release from work duties without pay) if they live in the same household as the child. If only one parent takes parental leave, it can last up to the end of the child's 22nd month. Last through the child's month of life. If both parents take parental leave alternately, it can last until the end of the child's second year of life at the latest. Last through the child's year of life.

Parents are generally not allowed to take parental leave simultaneously (exception: the first-time transfer of parental leave between the parents).

Parental leave begins for the parent who claims it first, eight weeks or twelve weeks (end of the protection period) after the child's birth.

The minimum duration of parental leave or its portion is two months. Parental leave may be divided twice between the parents, allowing for a total of three parental leave portions.

Both parents have the option to postpone three months of their parental leave. This deferred parental leave can be used until the child's 7th birthday or, at the latest, upon later school enrollment.

Mothers, fathers, and foster parents may take on marginal employment during parental leave either with the employer to whom the parental employment relationship applies or with another employer. In such employment, the monthly remuneration may not exceed the marginal earnings threshold (2025: €551.10).

When parental leave is taken, protection against termination and dismissal extends until four weeks after the end of the parental leave or part thereof.

PARENTAL PART-TIME WORK

Parents can take up to 7 years of parental part-time work until the child turns 8. Can be taken during the child's first year of life.

Requirements:

- You work in a company with more than 20 employees.
- You work in a company with more than 20 employees.
- Your employment relationship with the employer has lasted at least 3 continuous years.
- You live with the child in the same household (or you have custody).
- The 2nd The parent may not be on parental leave simultaneously for the same child.
- Part-time employment must last at least two months.
- You must observe a range regarding working hours.

The start and duration of the part-time employment, as well as the extent and timing of working hours, must be agreed upon with the employer. Employees who make use of part-time employment have the right to return to their original working hours after it ends. Protection against termination and dismissal ends 4 weeks after the end of parental part-time work, but no later than four weeks after the child's 4th birthday.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Family Bonus Plus

The Family Bonus Plus is a tax credit of €2,000 (from 2022) per child per year until the child's 18th birthday. After the 18th birthday, a reduced Family Bonus Plus of €700 (2025) per year applies, provided family allowance is received for this child. The Family Bonus Plus at the legally specified amount applies to children residing in the country. For children in the EU, the EEA, or Switzerland, the Family Bonus Plus is indexed (increased or decreased) to reflect the price level of the country of residence. A supplement called the 'child additional amount' of €700 (2025) per child per year is also provided for single parents or earners with low income. This amount is paid out together with the (eligible for negative tax) single earner tax credit. The Family Bonus Plus is also available for children of separated parents. In this case, both the family allowance recipient and the person who pays child support can claim it. There are two ways to claim your Family Bonus Plus: either by submitting form E 30 to your employer or through your tax return or employee tax assessment. If you file an employee tax assessment, the Family Bonus Plus must be claimed again—even if you have already applied for it through your employer—to avoid an unintended additional payment.

Parent-Child allowance

The Parent-Child allowance is granted to one parent (adoptive or foster) if both the parent and the child have their main residence in Upper Austria at the time of application, the child is primarily cared for by the parent, and lives with them in the same household.

The Parent-Child allowance amounts to €405 and is paid in three installments of €135 each.

The first installment is paid upon completion of the child's second year of life (Parent-Child Pass check-ups up to the second year, i.e. from the 22nd to 26th month of life, including an eye examination); the second installment is paid after completion of the fifth Years of life (proof up to the last Parent-Child Pass examination and confirmation of a dental check-up showing a caries-free or restored dentition) and the third part after completion of the eighth year of life (administration of the booster vaccination against diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis-polio

– conducted in the third grade of primary school – and another dental health check confirming a caries-free or restored dentition) is applied for. The payment is made exclusively by transfer to a current account (IBAN) at a financial institution, which must be specified in the application. The original application form (health booklet) is available from your general practitioner or pediatrician. You submit the application using the form to:

Childcare bonus

Families who do not use the free kindergarten care until 1 p.m. will be supported from the child's 3rd birthday up to a maximum of the start of the mandatory kindergarten year, with €960 annually. The childcare bonus is paid in two installments without an income limit and is restricted to EU residents.

Applications must be submitted using the (online) form to the Family Department of the State of Upper Austria.

Upper Austria Multiple Birth Allowance

The allowance is paid once upon application and is not dependent on income. Requirements: shared main residence of the applicant and the multiples in Upper Austria, receipt of family allowance, Austrian citizenship or citizenship of another EU member state, application submitted no later than the multiples' first birthday. Amount of support for twins:

€550 in cash and a €100 voucher for the "Mobile Family Service" of Caritas. For each additional multiple: a further €550 in cash and an additional €100 voucher for the "Mobile Family Service" of Caritas. The "Mobile Family Services" offer assistance and support in challenging situations. Caritas family helpers visit the home by the hour as needed to assist parents with the care and nursing of infants. The state of Upper Austria provides value vouchers that can be redeemed for these services.

Childcare allowance

This financial subsidy can be received by women and men who need a childcare place for their children because, for example, they want to start work or participate in a labor market-relevant program. The requirements are: the child must live in the same household and be younger than 15 years, and the income must not exceed a certain limit. The assistance is conditional on a counseling session.

Emergency assistance

Simultaneous receipt of childcare allowance and emergency assistance is generally possible. However, entitlement to emergency assistance exists only for persons who are available to the labor market without significant restrictions. This means your child is verifiably cared for – for example, in a kindergarten, after-school care, or with a childminder. Please also check with your health insurance provider whether emergency assistance affects your entitlement to the childcare allowance.

Exemption from the prescription fee

Under certain conditions, no prescription fee is required. However, except for cases already regulated by law, the exemption must be applied for at the health insurance fund.

- Persons whose monthly net income does not exceed the following limits (2025):
€1,273.99 for single persons, or
€2,009.85 for married couples or partners.
- Persons who can demonstrate above-average expenses due to illness or disability:
€ 1,465.09 for single individuals or
€ 2,311.33 for married couples or partners.

The amounts increase by € 196.57 for each child living in the household.

If the application is approved, the exemption from the prescription fee is recorded electronically and can be accessed by the doctor via e-card.

Family Hardship Compensation

Financial bridging assistance to remove or ease an emergency situation may be granted if:

- there is an unintended financial emergency caused by a specific event (illness, disability, death, etc.),
- family allowance is being received or expectant mothers,
- Austrian citizenship (also possible for EU citizens, refugees, or stateless persons) is held,
- all other options (maintenance claims, social assistance, housing allowance, etc.) are insufficient.

The financial bridging assistance must be used appropriately (this must be demonstrated). Otherwise, it must be repaid, including interest.

Single parents/

Single earner tax credit

The single parent tax credit applies if:

- the taxpayer has not lived in a marital-like partnership for more than six months, and
- during this period, at least one child qualifies for the child tax credit.

The single earner tax credit applies if:

- the taxpayer has been married for more than six months in the calendar year and is not permanently separated from the spouse, and
- if family allowance was received for one or more children for more than six months in the year and
- the spouse's income does not exceed € 7,284 annually.

This also applies to unmarried partnerships, including same-sex partnerships.

The following annual tax credits are available for single parents and single earners:

- with one child: € 601

- with two children: € 813
- this amount increases by € 268 for each additional child.

Both tax credits can be claimed either through the employer or afterwards via the employee tax assessment. If you have low income and are entitled to the single earner or single parent tax credit, these payments can be received.

Family Card of the State of Upper Austria

New: Expectant parents can apply for the Upper Austria Family Card as the 'First Card' even before the birth of their first child.

Requirements for receiving the 'First Card' of the Upper Austria Family Card:

- Pregnancy with the first child from the 20th week onwards
- The main residence of the expectant parents must be in Upper Austria
- For foreign nationals (excluding citizens of an EU member state), lawful residence in Austria (residence permit, proof of stay in Austria, etc.) is required

When applying for the First Card, proof of the expected due date is required (e.g., Parent-Child Pass or confirmation that has also been or will be presented to the employer, etc.).

Applications must be submitted via the online form at familienkarte.at. The Upper Austria Family Card will be provided digitally in the Family Card App after verification. After the child's birth, the birth certificate must be submitted to extend the Upper Austria Family Card.

Benefit Providers of the Upper Austria Family Card

Whether it's a visit to the zoo, an adventure park, a museum visit, or a relaxed family meal – the benefit providers make every outing special, with families at the heart of the experience.



Parent Education Account:

With the issuance of the 'First card' of the Upper Austria Family Card, expectant parents receive an Upper Austria parent education voucher valued at 20 euros.

Upper Austria Parent education vouchers can be redeemed at all events marked with the voucher symbol.

The full range of parent education offerings is available at www.familienkarte.at and in the Family Card App. These events take place at educational institutions in Upper Austria, parent-child centers, family organizations, public providers, and numerous private initiatives. The amount shown on the voucher is deducted directly from the participation fee. The vouchers are settled directly by the event organizer with the state of Upper Austria.

Additional parent education vouchers worth 20 Euros each are automatically granted to parents when the child is registered with the Upper Austria Family Card (at birth) and on the child's 3rd, 6th, and 10th birthdays.

Medical aids and assistive devices

For example, breast pumps, apnea monitors for respiratory monitoring, and abduction pants for hip joint problems are provided by the ÖGK on medical prescription if medically necessary. You take the medical prescription to the contracting partner or authorized specialist provider. The prescription must be redeemed within 30 days of the issue date. There is no deductible for children under 15 years old.



VACCINATIONS

In Upper Austria, a vaccination voucher booklet is available for vaccinating infants and toddlers, enabling free vaccination of all children with the vaccines recommended in the general vaccination schedule. The vaccination voucher booklet is issued during the first Parent-Child Pass examinations by the attending physician or the maternity ward and is linked to the child's identity via a barcode.

Vaccinations for infants and toddlers are provided free of charge by general practitioners, pediatricians, or at the parent/mother counseling centers.

ALL ABOUT BREASTFEEDING

Midwives provide advice and support on all questions concerning breastfeeding and the nutrition of children in their first year of life, helping to overcome any difficulties. They are true breastfeeding experts due to their basic training, but also offer competent advice on bottle feeding and the introduction of solid foods. Breastfeeding services are available in hospital maternity wards, breastfeeding groups and meetings, parent-child centers, and more.

Breastfeeding consultations and support groups are offered throughout Upper Austria in parent-child centers, parent counseling centers, various private institutions, with midwives, and more.

DENTAL CARE IN TODDLERS

Before the teeth break through, parents can already lay the foundation for healthy teeth in their child. Baby teeth can be easily colonized by the parents' cavity-causing bacteria. Tooth decay is a contagious disease. Licking pacifiers, spoons, and bottle nipples is a common way these germs are transmitted. Accustom your child to unsweetened drinks in a bottle or cup and to regular, healthy meals. At night, your child should neither eat nor drink milk, juice, or sweetened tea. Continuous sucking on bottles with sweetened drinks leads to early childhood tooth decay.

A pacifier is safe up to the age of two. Jaw-shaped pacifiers that are appropriate for the child's age are preferable. By the time the child turns three, they should no longer need a pacifier. The first dental visit should ideally take place early (from the eruption of the first teeth) so that the child has a positive experience at the dental office and any potential problems can be detected and treated early. Dental care begins with the first tooth. Brushing should be playful yet consistent, using a small children's toothbrush. Use fluoride toothpaste in the evening. Afterward, the child should not eat or drink anything except water. In the first years of life, toothbrushing should always be done by the parents. At 'KIDZ', the dental health center, dentists and specialist staff focus on the dental health of children under 14 years old. You have extensive experience with children and are happy to support you and your children.

Dental Passport

The Dental Passport is an offer for children insured in Upper Austria aged 5 to 14 who have a higher risk of developing caries (tooth decay). The Dental Passport is issued only by a dentist when an increased risk of caries is identified in your child. It includes:

- Tips for proper dental care for children, and
- free vouchers worth

€ 800,- for special dental treatments for your child.

This is intended to prevent or reduce tooth decay. Dental passport treatments include, for example, sealing the teeth, individual toothbrushing instruction, fluoride treatment, and more. The vouchers can be redeemed with certain dentists.

VIDEO GUIDE FOR PARENTS

(In several languages)

Around the time of birth, many questions arise, especially for young parents: How much sleep does my baby need, and how can I tell when they are tired?

What might cause my baby to cry, and what tricks can I use to soothe them? What needs does my baby have, and how can I interact with them through play?

BABY SWIMMING

The goal of baby swimming is to introduce children to water very early, encourage first diving attempts, and provide play and enjoyment in the water. The innate trust that babies have in water should be preserved and nurtured. Baby swimming is intended for babies aged 4 to 16 months.

You can find opportunities, among others, at parent-child centers in Upper Austria, VHS Upper Austria, Nessie Association Water Fun, swimacademy, private providers, and more.

BABY MASSAGE

During a baby massage, there is an intense exchange between mother or father and child. The gentle touches on the baby's skin act like balm for the soul. In other words, when a child is massaged, it receives an extra portion of emotional nourishment. Massage lays an essential foundation for the child's harmonious development in mental, emotional, and physical areas.

ALONE WITH THE CHILD

CUSTODY - OBSORGE

The term Obsorge refers to the parental rights and responsibilities (care and upbringing of the child, legal representation, and management of assets) regarding the minor child. Both parents share custody if they are married at the time of the birth or from the time of marriage, if they marry after the birth.

Unmarried parents can apply for joint custody directly at the registry office or the court following the birth of their child. A parent without custody of an unmarried child can also apply to the court for joint custody, and the court must grant this if joint custody is, based on experience within a court-determined period, in the child's

best interests. When the court issues a ruling to change custody, the parent who previously had custody of the unmarried child no longer has veto rights. Family court assistance is available to all district courts across Austria. Family courts are supported by a judicial department staffed with psychologists and social workers to assist in child custody proceedings. There is also the possibility of reaching an amicable solution in families experiencing conflict through a process called "clearing."

PARENT COUNSELLING

(before amicable divorce)

Parties to an amicable divorce are required, prior to finalizing or submitting an arrangement regarding the consequences of the divorce, to certify to the court that they have sought advice from a suitable person or institution about the specific needs of their minor children arising from the divorce. Without such counselling, it is not possible to obtain an amicable divorce. The parties must credibly prove this counselling to the court— for example, by submitting a confirmation— otherwise the process may be significantly delayed.

DETERMINATION OF PATERNITY

As the child's legal representative, the mother is responsible for initiating the determination of paternity. A child has the right to know who their father is. Additionally, both maintenance claims and inheritance rights depend on the establishment of paternity. If a father does not acknowledge his child, the mother can file an application for paternity determination with the court. Upon her request (with written consent), child and youth welfare services support the mother in the legal process of establishing paternity.

CHILD SUPPORT / MAINTENANCE

Children have the right to maintenance as long as they are not able to support themselves. Parents are primarily responsible for providing maintenance. If both parents are unable to provide maintenance, under certain conditions the grandparents may also be required to provide maintenance.

Both parents are required to contribute to maintenance according to their financial capacity. If parents live with the child in the same household, maintenance is provided by the parents meeting the child's everyday needs with everything necessary ("in-kind maintenance"). If one parent lives separately from the child, they must pay their share of the child's maintenance in the form of a monetary payment ("alimony").

Maintenance must be provided even if there is no contact with the child. If contact occurs very frequently (beyond the usual scope of visitation rights), it may be that less maintenance is required.

A written agreement on maintenance is always advisable when the parents do not live in the same household as the child (i.e., when maintenance must be paid by the parent living separately as a monetary payment). This also applies if the parents generally agree on the payment of maintenance. Parents can conclude an agreement on the amount of maintenance either at the court or through child and youth welfare services.

If no agreement is reached on the amount of maintenance, the court (competent district or guardianship court) must determine it.

Applications to this effect can be submitted by the child themselves (or their legal representative) and the parent obliged to pay maintenance. The parent entrusted with

custody can also delegate the representation of the child to the Child and Youth Welfare Service. The Child and Youth Welfare Service then agrees with the maintenance obligor on the amount of maintenance or files the appropriate court application.

RIGHT OF ACCESS

Each parent and the child have a legal right to meet one another. The right of access, formerly known as visitation rights, should generally be arranged by mutual agreement between both parents and the child. If an agreement cannot be reached, the court must make a decision. Legal enforcement measures apply against a parent entitled to contact who, to the detriment of the child, refuses personal contact. In such proceedings, the court may appoint family court assistance as a 'visitation mediator,' who, through their presence and supervision, facilitates the proper handover and return of the child. A child over 14 years old can largely decide on contact independently. For example, they have the right to submit an application to the court to regulate contact rights on their own and also to decline contact.

Visitation supervision

Visitation supervision provides the opportunity for minor children to maintain regular contact with the entitled parent despite separation. In the presence of a professionally qualified visitation supervisor, children can spend time with the entitled person in a protected and child-friendly setting. Supervised visitation is confidential, except for the obligation to report to the court. There are no costs if the criteria for subsidized supervised visitation are met:

- the person entitled to visitation does not exceed a specific income threshold, and
- there is a court order for supervised visitation issued by the responsible guardianship court.

Mediation in Separation and Divorce

If you and your partner are unable to reach an agreement on matters related to your separation or divorce—such as division of assets, maintenance, or visitation rights regar-

ding your joint child or children—you can access family mediation supported by the Federal Chancellery. One hour of mediation costs €220 per mediation team. Depending on your family income—which you must verify to the mediators by providing wage statements, payslips, or similar documents—and the number of children entitled to maintenance, the Federal Chancellery provides a subsidy or you will be required to pay a deductible. The amount of the deductible is calculated by the mediators; you pay your deductible per hour of mediation, and the mediators handle the subsidy. Current tariff rates can be found on the website below. Funding can only be claimed if you choose mediators listed in the Federal Chancellery's register. The qualifications required of the mediators and other provisions for funded family mediation are detailed in the 'Guidelines for the Promotion of Mediation.'

Parent, Mother Counseling, and IGLU Counseling Centers

Pregnancy and birth are a very special time during which a couple must reorient themselves. Along with the anticipation of the child and the new role of being parents, this transitional period also brings uncertainties and doubts. It is quite common for young parents to sometimes feel completely overwhelmed during this phase. A baby does not follow a manual; getting to know them well—that is, noticing their signals, interpreting them correctly, and responding appropriately—is often very challenging at first. To support you in building a secure bond with your baby, there are services such as parental and maternal counseling, including the IGLU counseling centers.

Alongside measuring and weighing, there is time for questions

about development, breastfeeding, sleeping, nutrition, child support, and much more.

Counseling for Child and Youth Welfare

Families eventually reach their limits – sometimes the challenges children bring can no longer be managed alone. However, these worries do not have to be carried alone. The social workers of the Child and Youth Welfare service address each situation individually and provide support where it is needed. No one is left alone with their worries! Even when people – whether in private or professional settings – notice that a child is not doing well, they can turn to Child and Youth Welfare for support. The staff are trained to offer families advice and support and to provide help where it is needed. All the information you need if you are concerned about a child and want to report your concern can be found at www.kjh-ooe.at. Child and youth welfare takes all notifications in this context very seriously and involves the affected families, parents, children, and young people in a joint and transparent process to determine whether they need any assistance and what kind of help is appropriate.

Mobile Family Coaching (MFC)

The MFC is a free, preventive, and voluntary service aimed directly at families, designed to help mitigate crises. Key elements include the advice hotline for quick support, personal coaching sessions conducted by phone or in the families' homes, and the advice bus, which visits

public places and events to offer spontaneous and easily accessible initial consultations.

Support is available for all issues that arise in everyday family life, such as conflicts and disagreements, overwhelm and exhaustion, media use, learning difficulties and school stress, parenting and developmental questions, separations and family changes, and much more. If your child cannot currently live with you and it is still uncertain whether you may be able to care for them at a later date, care in another family is a possible option. Foster care and upbringing can be provided by people from your environment, such as grandparents or close relatives, or by professionally trained foster parents sought through child and youth welfare services. This allows you to maintain personal contact with your child and, in agreement with child and youth welfare services and the foster family, be involved in their life. In an adoption, you choose to transfer your parental rights to adoptive parents, and your child will grow up permanently with other parents. Because adoption is a significant decision for you, your child, and the adoptive parents that requires careful consideration, it also takes some time for the court to approve the adoption. Whether and what information is shared with you, the adoptive parents, or the child depends on the type of adoption. Child and youth welfare services are happy to advise you on the different types of adoption and their legal implications. The child and youth welfare services in the respective districts are responsible.

CRISIS FOSTER FAMILY

Crisis foster families provide infants and young children, who temporarily cannot be cared for by their parents or legal guardians due to a crisis, the chance to grow and develop within a family setting. These families are characterized by a stable family system with emotionally available and consistent caregivers who live with the children. They can quickly respond to a child's individual needs and demonstrate a high level of flexibility, empathy, and reliability. Crisis foster families are selected, qualified, and employed by plan B and receive professional support,

guidance, and ongoing training.



STAYING HEALTHY – BEING ILL

HELP FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

SPEECH THERAPY

To ensure that children who need help with their language development receive it, all 4- to 5-year-old children in kindergartens across Upper Austria undergo a speech therapy screening. Speech therapists assess children's

language and speaking skills in a playful way. If any concerns arise, parents are offered a consultation. If you feel your child needs support in learning to speak: For children not yet of school age, speech therapy services provided by Volkshilfe Upper Austria, Caritas, and the Linz city administration are available throughout Upper Austria. These services are funded by child and youth welfare as well as social insurance providers. With the ÖGK, costs are fully covered; with other health insurance providers, parents may need to pay small co-payments. About 40% of children between the ages of 2 and 6 experience various difficulties during language acquisition, for example: the child forms sentences incorrectly or incompletely, has difficulty telling stories, struggles to find words, does not understand sentences, mispronounces or omits sounds, or stutters. With the help of the speech therapist, children learn to understand language and use it correctly, so they can enjoy speaking. This is an important foundation for academic success. In speech therapy, children learn through games and exercises how to form sentences correctly, pronounce sounds accurately, and much more. The speech therapist also guides parents on how to best support their child at home. Regular practice at home is essential for the success of the therapy. Currently, 38 speech therapists from Volkshilfe Gesundheits- und Soziale Dienste GmbH assess all 4- to 5-year-old children in public and some private kindergartens every autumn. During a standardized speech therapy screening, the child's language development and hearing are evaluated. Afterwards, parents have the opportunity to discuss the examination results with the speech therapist.

They will receive advice on which measures are important for the child, such as speech therapy or an evaluation by a doctor or occupational therapist....

For the first therapy appointment, parents need a referral from a doctor, after which the therapy will be billed to the respective health insurance provider. This is generally free of charge for parents, though some health insurance providers may charge small co-payments. Further information is available at

CHILD IN HOSPITAL

When a child's hospital stay is unavoidable, the physical distress experienced by the child is accompanied by the parents' uncertainty about finding the best treatment option. Which hospital is appropriate? Is an inpatient stay unavoidable, or is outpatient treatment possible? Can a familiar person accompany the child? Not all hospitals have children's wards, but children are admitted at all of them. Regarding visiting hours, the visiting times set by the respective hospital apply. In addition, parents can visit at any time after consulting with a doctor or nurse (special visiting hours for parents) – though exceptions exist here as well. When children need to be hospitalized, under certain conditions an adult companion can also be admitted as an inpatient. For admitting a companion, it is important to register as soon as possible, if feasible, as this depends on bed availability. To allow all parents to accompany their children during necessary hospital stays and thereby promote the child's recovery, the state of Upper Austria covers the costs for the companion—except for a daily deductible of €5.10.

Requirements for the admission of an adult companion

- The child and companion are admitted to a public hospital in Upper Austria.

- Only in particularly exceptional cases, with the consent of the hospital's medical director, if accommodation for the companion in the hospital is possible.

Special case: Babies in the first year of life

If an infant can only be admitted together with the mother (or another companion), or if the mother requires hospital care, she may bring her baby. In this case, no co-payment will be charged.

At the clinic for child and adolescent psychiatry and psychotherapeutic medicine, children and adolescents aged 1 to 18 with disorders or illnesses affecting their biological, intellectual, psychological, personality-oriented, and social development and maturity are examined and treated. Children and adolescents with pediatric or pediatric surgical needs are co-managed at Med Campus IV through interdisciplinary collaboration among the respective specialist disciplines.

The Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry includes 12 beds and 5 day-clinic treatment places. The Psychosomatics Department offers 15 beds for inpatient diagnosis and treatment. The range of treatments offered by both care units includes the classic diagnoses in child and adolescent psychiatry, such as anxiety disorders, depression, activity and attention disorders, conduct disorders with oppositional behavior, autism spectrum disorders, specific developmental disorders, stress reactions, and trauma-related disorders. Other conditions covered, also within the psychosomatic treatment spectrum, include eating disorders, functional (somatoform) disorders, chronic pain disorders, non-organic sleep disorders, elimination disorders, as well as regulatory and interaction disorders in early childhood.

The clinic offers:

- clinical examination and evaluation of diseases, malformations, or functional disorders of the female genitalia caused by organic, hormonal, chromosomal, or injury-related factors in young or adolescent girls
- the first gynecological examination, education, and counseling for adolescent patients
- evaluation in cases of suspected sexual abuse

It is crucial to identify and treat malformations or functional disorders early, before irreversible damage occurs to the adolescent organism.

Child Protection Group

The establishment of Child Protection Groups in hospitals with pediatric departments has been legally established in the Hospital Act. The Child Protection Group is a multiprofessional panel. It addresses infants, children, and adolescents who have been confirmed or are suspected victims of abuse or neglect, or who are at risk of being abused or neglected. Members of the Child Protection Group include, among others, doctors from various specialties, psychologists, social workers, and nursing staff. The members advise the treating physicians and also provide counseling to those affected and their families. They make recommendations and, if necessary, establish contact with agencies outside the hospital (such as child protection centers, child and youth welfare services, and the police). The child's well-being and protection are the highest priorities. If you have a justified suspicion that a child or adolescent is affected by violence or neglect, you can come to the respective hospitals with the child or adolescent (up to the age of 18). If necessary, further measures will be taken there.

If an important caregiver is temporarily unavailable, care must be provided quickly, especially for children. Is the mother ill or overwhelmed? Does she need support during pregnancy or after childbirth? Or does a single parent have no entitlement to care leave for a sick child?

Qualified family helpers from Caritas are then available. These helpers have professional training to take over childcare and household management. In special, highly stressful situations where you need support for your family over an extended period, long-term assistance can be provided. Long-term assistance can be approved for a period starting from 12 weeks. The Mobile Family Services are therefore offered as short-term or long-term assistance for families with children up to 18 years of age.

CARING LEAVE AND CARE SUPPORT

If a child's caregiver is unavailable or close relatives or household members fall ill, employees can take caring leave.

You are entitled to care leave immediately upon starting your employment relationship. Illness includes not only

acute or sudden illnesses but also chronic conditions. The key factor is whether care dependency exists.

You may also take care leave if you are prevented from working due to the necessary care of your healthy child (biological or foster child) because the person who normally cares for the child is unable to do so for serious reasons – for example, due to illness, hospitalization, death, etc. Living in the same household as the child is not required.

You are entitled to continued payment of wages for up to one week per year of employment. In addition, an extra week of care leave is available within a working year if the child becomes care-dependent again and is under 12 years old.

Child must go to hospital

- For the care of your child (biological or foster child) in the hospital, you may take leave to provide care if the child is under 10 years old. The child has not yet reached the age of 10 (i.e., is under 10 years old).
- You may accompany the biological child of your spouse, registered partner, or partner to the hospital until the child's 10th birthday, provided you live in the same household with the biological parent and the child.

Important: Notification obligation! You must inform your employer as soon as possible if you need to stay home to care for your child.

FAMILY HOSPICE LEAVE

Employees have the option, under family hospice leave, to accompany dying relatives and their severely ill children living in the same household for a specified period. Measures for end-of-life care or support for critically ill children can also be undertaken simultaneously by several relatives. The following options are available to employees:

- Reduction of working hours
- Change in the scheduling of working hours (e.g., early shift to late shift)
- Exemption from work without pay (= parental leave)

Deadline: Support for critically ill children can initially be agreed with the employer for a maximum of five months. If necessary, an extension of up to a total of nine months per case is possible.

Note: This measure must be communicated to the employer in writing.

Attention: From the time the support for critically ill children is announced, the employee is protected from termination or dismissal until four weeks after it ends. The unused entitlement to vacation, as well as the entitlement to special payments, is prorated for this period in the respective working year.

Persons who have agreed to a family hospice parental leave are entitled to nursing parental leave allowance. The Social Ministry Service (formerly the Federal Social Office) decides on the granting, withdrawal, or reassessment of this allowance.

For the duration of receiving nursing parental leave allowance,

- there is protection against termination for cause,
- and the pension insurance contribution as well as the health insurance contribution are covered by the federal government.
- Employees acquire an entitlement to severance pay, and
- periods of receiving nursing parental leave allowance lead to an extension of the qualifying period for unemployment benefit entitlement.

Amount of care parental leave allowance during care parental leave and family hospice parental leave

The basic amount of the care parental leave allowance is income-dependent and is paid at the same rate as the unemployment benefit (55% of the daily net income, calculated based on average gross earnings), but at least at the monthly marginal earnings threshold. In the case of part-time care, the amount is calculated proportionally. Child supplements are provided for dependent children.

Application process

If the application is submitted within 14 days of starting care parental leave, part-time care, or family hospice parental leave, the care parental leave allowance is granted from the start of the measure. If the application is submitted after this period but before the end of care parental leave, part-time care, or family hospice parental leave, the allowance is granted from the date of application. Applications submitted after the end of care paren-

tal leave, part-time care, or family hospice parental leave will be rejected as late. The Federal Office for Social Affairs and Disability decides on the granting, withdrawal, or reassessment of parental leave care allowance.

Individuals who take family hospice parental leave may receive financial support in addition to the parental leave care allowance if they take a full leave of absence with labor and social law protection (family hospice parental leave) to care for and accompany terminally ill relatives or seriously ill children. A condition for receiving this support is that a financial hardship results from the loss of income due to family hospice parental leave. Such a case is assumed when the weighted average net income of the recipient's household falls below € 850 per month due to the loss of income. The Kepler University Clinic is the largest maternity clinic in Austria. It has state-of-the-art delivery rooms where pregnant women give birth with support from midwives and obstetricians. A tour of the delivery rooms is possible as part of the offered antenatal classes. To get an initial impression, you can also take a virtual tour on the homepage.

- An outpatient examination around 2-3 weeks before the due date is recommended at the antenatal clinic.
- Birth preparation courses for couples and women, acupuncture and acupressure, and nutritional advice during pregnancy and breastfeeding are offered.
- Relaxation aids before birth
- Three bathtubs, birthing stools/chairs, Pezzi balls, a mat, a climbing frame, and a mobile CTG are included in the delivery room equipment.
- Homeopathy and herbal teas, aromatherapy care, acupressure, moxibustion, ear seed therapy, and acupuncture massage according to Penzel are offered.
- Perineal stitching is performed on request for both vaginal births and cesarean sections. A comprehensive range of services is provided here, from outpatient births and breastfeeding preparation to psychological postpartum care. Emphasis is placed on holistic care for mother and child during the postnatal period, 24-hour rooming-in, and optimal breastfeeding support.

BABY CARE

What a joy—the baby has arrived! But how do you hold it properly? How do you change diapers? How do you bathe and care for delicate baby skin? How should the baby sleep? This module provides ample time for participants' questions.

- The Institute for Prenatal Medicine is a specialized facility for the diagnosis, assessment, and management of fetal abnormalities, as well as the care and monitoring of so-called 'high-risk pregnancies.'
- The Kepler University Clinic also has a human genetics institute, enabling prenatal genetic evaluations to be performed quickly and efficiently.

All healthy newborns at the clinic are cared for in the maternity ward. As part of the stay for mother and child around the time of birth and during the first days of the postnatal period, the babies are examined within the first 24 hours and around the fourth day. Clinically examined by the pediatrician on the day of life. As a routine, every child undergoes hip ultrasound examinations, hearing screening, and metabolic testing.

In addition to 'outpatient childbirth,' many mothers also increasingly take advantage of the option of 'early discharge' after childbirth. After three days, you go home with your baby. There, you will continue to receive visits and care during the postnatal period from a midwife.



- The 'GENTLE' Caesarean Section
- Modern, gentle, and careful techniques are used. These techniques reduce the hospital stay to just a few days. Expectant fathers can, of course, be present in the operating room during planned Caesarean sections to welcome their child together with the mother.
- 'Bonding Sectio' after Caesarean is a top priority.
- Pain relief with epidural anesthesia (spinal injection) is also available on request.
- Breastfeeding is a special priority; well-trained staff provide round-the-clock support. After discharge from the hospital, the breastfeeding clinic is available.

- Outpatient childbirth is possible; further care must be ensured by a midwife.





The specialists in the Parenting Support Department can offer counseling or care in a variety of family situations. Social work counseling addresses educational questions, puberty challenges, behavioral issues in children, questions regarding visitation or custody arrangements related to separation or divorce, as well as delinquency in children and adolescents. It is possible to work purposefully and with a resource-oriented approach with families to find solutions. In individual cases, cooperation takes place with institutions or social services, or referrals are made to specialized social services. As part of parenting support, meaning support for parents' educational work, measures to safeguard the child's welfare (child protection) can be taken. Intervention takes place in cases of neglect or endangerment of children and young people. Any necessary outpatient, day-care, and inpatient measures are supported by qualified social workers.

Parental contributions have been introduced for afternoon care starting at 1 PM. The maximum contribution for care from 1 PM is €128 per month.

The city of Linz has decided that the “Linz Tariff Model” (applicable to both municipal and private institutions) will be applied in the future. This means that families with very low incomes will continue to pay no fees for afternoon care. The maximum contribution can be up to €72.52!
